

“Experiencing Birth”

A Clairvoyant’s View

The following are insights about unborn babies excerpted from clairvoyant readings generated by Jean Mastellone.

A pregnant woman usually puts almost no focus or attention on the physical, mental, and emotional experiences her baby may have gone through during the pregnancy or birthing process. However, all throughout womb life an unborn baby has been having such experiences; this is especially true during birthing.

- Every unborn baby possesses a natural, innate ability to “go with the flow” of what is happening when his or her mother’s contractions start and birthing becomes a reality. It is not as if the baby knows what to do ahead of time, rather, a fetus has the innate ability to agree with and accept what is naturally happening.

- When a mother has a truly right relationship with her pregnancy, her baby, and her baby’s birth, and if her baby is willing and does not fight the process, it is probable that mother and baby will have an easy time during the birth. Nonetheless, this is often the exception rather than the rule because of the subconscious negativity that occurs between mother and her fetus during pregnancy and the birthing process.

- Being born physically is usually a natural progression of the psychic-energetic interactions that have been occurring all throughout life in the womb. If those interactions were truly positive, the birth and infancy are likely to be similarly positive, and vice versa.

- Nine month fetuses instinctively know that they are being born and instinctively also know what to do. Every baby about to be born has a role to play in his or her birth. A fetus can choose to participate in the birth process in positive or negative ways. A fetus is intuitively able to go along with the birth process or can choose to become fearful, angry, or resistant in reaction to his or her new situation. Some fetuses close-off and withdraw from the angry energies of a mother who is not happy about the birth.

- A mother's fearful and angry images and feelings can inhibit a fetus from following the intuitive knowledge available to him or her during the time of birth. Were a fetus to not selfishly react to his or her mother and stop trying to control and resist the physical changes being experienced, the baby would go through the birth process in an accepting and easier way. That means he would have to drop his reactions to his mother, which includes his resistance, anger, fear and panic.

- Many babies about to be born feel desperate. They are not experiencing the truth about their births. Many rapidly retreat inward, not seeing that there is nothing to fear. They become contained within themselves and become caught up in their panic and imaginings.

- These fetuses lose a sense of self and the right way to be in relation to their birthing. They perceive their situation as a confused upheaval because they are not willing to trust their circumstances. They feel that their current situation is not right, but this is because they want to be in control and cannot control this experience. Many babies become disoriented and incoherent when the contractions start.

- The outer disturbances created by the physical changes during birthing are triggering inner disturbances

caused by panic about losing control. In this state, many babies become fearful anticipating what might happen next. All of these reactions negate their naturally clairvoyant ability to see clearly and their ability to act rightly.

- Their sense of loss of control and their lack of intuitive understanding make these babies feel as if they were dying, rather than being born. They wrongly sense their lives are being taken away, or being squeezed out of them.

- They usually blame their mothers for their confusion, fear, and pain. Many are born angry about their new physical circumstances. They react to the negative ideas and feelings of both their parents, especially to the ideas and feelings that relate directly to them.

- Resisting their birthing drives babies to psychologically separate from this important next step in their lives, entry into the air world. When babies rebel against the natural push toward the birth canal, many become physically rigid and start fighting mentally and emotionally.

- Fighting their exit from the womb generates confusion and incoherence.

- When babies do not experience genuine love from their mothers or fathers, it can lead to a deep sense of insecurity, of not being wanted, and a fear they will not be properly nurtured. These are “sense-feeling images” that the babies generate, not the kind of thoughts or feelings we adults usually consciously experience.

- While in the womb, some fetuses rarely express their anger. During the birthing process, they may choose to

start expressing much of their pent-up angry feelings at the way their mothers have been treating them. They also respond well to genuine welcoming energies. []
